Pt's Report

On July 22, 1985, this 29 year old wanna be pastor worked his first day at CAC as Senior Pastor. And on April 23, 2023, this 67 year old pastor will work his last day at CAC. A run of 37 years and 9 months. Thanks be to God.

No one is more amazed by this than me. I became a Christ-follower when I was a young adult. I came to Christ kicking and digging in my heels. The last thing I ever aspired to be was a pastor. But then God began to perform open heart surgery on me. And as they say, the rest is history. Somedays I still have to pinch myself to make sure I'm not dreaming this up.

Looking back.

God used CAC to sanctify me. To shape me to be more Christ-like even though I've still got a long way to go. To a large degree, God used CAC to make me who I am today. Thanks be to God.

CAC loved a pastor out of me. Loved a teacher/preacher out of me. Loved a leader out of me. And loved a madly-in-love with people out of me the introvert. Thanks be to God.

This church stood by me as I made my share of mistakes (like firing the first staff person I hired without consulting the leadership) or stepped outside of the box (like that time I shaved my head, got an earring, and smoked a cigarette during my sermon). This church corrected me in love. Gave me time to grow up and learn how to love and lead you. Thanks be to God.

CAC loved and accepted Heather as well as Hannah and Liz - what a special gift you gave them. Thanks be to God.

I've dedicated your children, later baptized them, later officiated at their weddings, then visited them in hospitals when they birthed children, and now have been around long enough to watch some of those children grow up. Thanks be to God.

I've seen people say Yes to Jesus, had a front row seat to changed lives (sometimes fast but usually slow), watched marriages reconcile, seen people healed and delivered, observed people forgive each other and learn a new way of loving, and watched with wonder and awe at the hardships some of you experienced while keeping alive your love for Jesus and hopeful outlook on life as you suffered with patience and joy. Thanks be to God.

Be strong and courageous, and do the work. Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord God, my God, is with you. He will not fail you or forsake you until all the work of for the service of the temple of the Lord is finished (I Chronicles 28:20).

It has been one of the greatest privileges of my life to lead our Susu Partnership for almost 23 years. Little did I know that this partnership would take me to Sierra Leone (7 times) and Guinea (4 times). I had the joy of taking a total of 26 people with me on those trips. I love the Sesays and the team they have built in Sierra Leone. The Sesays are family to Heather and I and will always live deep within our hearts. Thanks be to God.

For the past 28 years we have taken up a Miracle Sunday Thanksgiving Offering totaling \$1,175,830 (a yearly average of \$41,994). We distribute our MSO to kingdom causes locally, regionally, and globally. Each year we funnel some of these dollars to Alliance missions and our International Workers. We are blessed to be a blessing to others. The MSO extends this blessing around the world, is used by God to further his kingdom, and gives witness to Jesus. Thanks be to God.

Our Susu Partnership and Miracle Sunday Offering express the DNA of our CAC mission and generosity. Thanks be to God!

My time here as lead pastor has been a team effort from the start. It was never about me but about the people God called and gifted to serve him and CAC alongside me with their prayer, gifts, vision, service, skills, experience, passions, and abilities. I led them even as they led me in the dance we learned to do together. Thanks be to God for our elders (Marlin Myers, Jeff Reister, Jim Trigg, Mel Yamase), staff (Joshua Stager, Nick Charbonnier, Melinda Beck, Rachel Keen, John VanAcker, Josh Payne, Alan Rudy), and our Administrative Board (Brent Beck, Lynne Brown, Bill Crumley, Rick Ellis, Joe Minson, Ellen Ostbo, Jenny Schuening, Michael Vissers). This is one of the best leadership teams I've had the privilege to lead in all my years at CAC. Thanks be to God.

Looking ahead.

The end of my long run at CAC is the start of a new CAC chapter. Endings are beginnings. I'm excited for what God has planned for your future. I leave you with these last words:

First, pray. This includes everyone. Bathe this transition time in prayer. Pray by yourself and with others. Come together as the church to pray. May God's kingdom come and will be done for CAC as in heaven. Trust in God from the bottom of your hearts.

Second, lean in. This is your church. Christ is its Head. None of us are indispensable including Pt. Don't leave. Don't run. Stay. Trust in what God is doing. The church is the Body of Christ and you are one of its important members. CAC needs you.

Third, be patient. This transition season is going to take longer than a minute. Hang in there. God does things in his time and we can't predict how long or how short his timeline is. Better to give the needed time to walk this transition to a new pastor than to speed up the process just to get it done and get on with your future.

Fourth, hang together. What an amazing opportunity you have to build community and relationships with one another. We are stronger together than we are alone. Renew or restart old relationships and/or build new ones.

Fifth, be open to change. The future is going to be different than the past. New leadership means new vision for a new season. Our theological beliefs never change but the way we live them out in a rapidly changing culture does. If the church doesn't change to meet these new realities, it will become less and less relevant and eventually die. Nobody wants that for CAC.

Sixth, love your new pastor. Love him like you loved, accepted, and supported me. He won't be perfect. He'll make mistakes. He's not Jesus. He's got a hard job. Let him know you're on his team. You loved a pastor, teacher/preacher, and leader out of me. I hope and pray you do the same with your new pastor. He will bring gifting, passions, and vision different than mine but, trusting God, will be just what you need.

I could not have stayed on my feet for 37 years in this role without the love and support of Heather. She went through everything I did. She shared my joy and sorrows. She offered her input and perspectives. I only wish I had listened to her more than I did. Thanks be to God.

Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain (I Corinthians 15:58).

Classes & Bible Studies

Their immediate willingness and consistent service has kept our live stream running for 150 Sundays!

Missions Team

In 2022, we sent 2 short-term trips to West Africa. In May, **Daniel Reister, Hope Martin**, and **Tim Barton** traveled to Sierra Leone to support the Hospital Project. In October-November, **Daniel Reister, Joshua Stager, Jeff Reister, Paul Knopp, Rick Ellis**, and **Rock Shetler** traveled to Sierra Leone to make progress on the Hospital Project and the SGM Agriculture project. Daniel and Joshua continued on to Guinea to connect with the Conakry Youth Team (aXcess) and Guinea Agropastoral Project Team (CAMA) in Dubreka. We welcomed Steve & Lori Albright (CAMA, Dubreka) to CAC in April and Chad Clason (aXcess, Conakry) in October.

This year, planning is in the works for a visit from Dr. Joseph Sesay in May, a visit from the Anderson and Novy families (CAMA, Dubreka) in June, and a potential short-term trip to Mexico in the summer, and a trip to West Africa in the fall/winter.

Susu Hospital Project Team

Planning work continues on the Susu Hospital Project led by **Dr. Joseph Sesay**. With funds contributed by donors and a \$40,000 commitment from the CAC General Fund by the Admin Board, the Hospital Team and Susu Gospel Ministry have purchased 4.3 acres of land and funded a Schematic Design of the Hospital. Our trip in the spring provided necessary images for our fundraising materials, and our trip in the fall laid the groundwork for our Memorandum of Understanding and for engineering cooperation between American architects and Sierra Leonean engineers. A few steps remain before we are prepared to begin fundraising, including the development of a complete Memorandum of Understanding between the Hospital Team and Susu Gospel Ministry, completion of the estimating work that has been initiated in Sierra Leone, and completion of a fundraising plan. We are also investigating the value of establishing this project as a separate 501(c)3 nonprofit organization.

Thanks to **100Fold Studios** for all the work they have done so far on the project. Thanks to **Kabba Sesay** for undertaking the cost estimate for the project in Sierra Leone. Thanks to everyone serving on the Hospital Team with me: **Tim Barton** (the heart of our long-term relationship with Susu Gospel Ministry), **Paul Knopp** (the champion of this project), **Pam Wilson** (our expert in international medicine), **Rick Ellis** (overseeing the financial sustainability of the project), **Daniel Reister** (willing to contribute in many ways), **Jeff Reister** (our construction-minded elder with a long relationship with Joseph), **Rock Shetler** (the engineering go-between translating US architect into SL engineer), **Mel Yamase** (who is leading the medical considerations of the project), and **Ray Keen** (our administrative/project/fundraising guru).

Thanks be to Christ, and to all the humans who make this church what it is!

Canby Alliance Youth

2022 was quite a year! From new leaders, graduation, Young Life trips to Canada, relationships forming, meals served, games played, Jesus talked about, and much more, this year has been jam packed and more exciting than ever.

To start off the year, we took 11 students to Twin Rocks Friends Camp in Rockaway Beach, OR for our annual "winter" retreat DARUDE. This trip was fully funded by CAC attenders who generously gave money to allow students to go on this trip completely free of cost. In the beginning of this year we introduced and fully solidified our student leadership program which welcomed 5 high school students into the middle school ministry to help lead and love these kids!

In early spring we also held our first middle school all-nighter. We had over 50 middle school students attend this event which went from 9pm - 7am! Our leaders were exhausted but kids had a blast and we plan on doing it (or a version of it) again in 2023. In late June, Nick led a group of 6 students up to Malibu Club in Canada through Young Life.

After Young Life camp, summer came and went real fast. Pastor Nick and Taylor welcome their new baby boy, Milo in mid-August and then before anyone could blink, the new school year had started and the youth group was back up and running.

This school year welcomed a few new elements: Metanoia (our Sunday morning program) returned and has been running smoothly since, our leadership team has now grown to 9 with an additional 4 high school leaders, we have brought back meals for the students every Wednesday night, and we had our annual moviemarathon in October (Harry Potter).

We ended the year with the enormous 7th annual Yuletide Spectacular- our Christmas party that we throw alongside Canby Young Life. We served almost 150 kids at what was the greatest Christmas party they will ever attend. We had an army of leaders, chefs, security, setup teams, teardown teams and everything in between. The sheer amount of man-hours it took to put this together was staggering, but it was all worth it as kids from this town came pouring in to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

We look forward to 2023 with hopes of continued growth, outreach, leadership development, spiritual maturity, but above all else, strong relationships with students. Since we are in large part an outreach to the city of Canby, relationships between leaders and students must remain our focus since most of these students are not affiliated with a church. It is the blessing of a friendship with a safe adult with no prior agenda that we believe will assist each student in their discovery of Jesus, saying "yes" to Him, and ultimately walking with Him for the rest of their lives. We are so grateful for this beautiful facility, generous donors, a congregation that gives and gives and gives and loves loves loves, and an admin and elder board that firmly stands behind our leaders, students, and ministry.

Thank you for such an incredible 2022, and here is to an even better 2023.

Increasing Children's Ministry in 2022

2022 has been a year of increasing numbers, structure and outreach. I pray that more kids, families and volunteers means growing relationships between people and with God. Here are some glimpses from 2022.

NUMBERS

Children and families involved. When the church reopened during the COVID-19 pandemic, I was aware of 3 families consistently participating. At 2022 year's end 16 families were engaged.

Monthly volunteers involved.

- Backup and substitute volunteers: 6

STRUCTURE

Monthly update email to families and volunteers included lesson info, prayer prompts and a thought for parents.

New Embers curriculum. Volunteers read from The Toddler Bible each week and shared a coloring sheet chosen to accompany it. Whenever possible the Bible passage was the same as the Sparks lesson.

Continuing Sparks curriculum. Teachers began using *brite curriculum published by Awana last year.

Sparks Classroom updates. Jeff Vian installed a TV monitor on the wall to show teaching or song videos. Colorful kid-movable footstools were purchased.

OUTREACH

Theater Camp. The Canby Center staff and volunteers, 6 believers outside the Canby Alliance congregation and 4 CAC volunteers joined to connect kids in the community to Christ and each other using theater. One week of half day camp for 4th-6th graders took place at CAC with 16 kids and a second week took place at Ackerman Center with 70 kids.

Please pray that the relationship with God increases for kids and families in and around CAC in 2023.

Canby Alliance Facility Manager Ministry Report 2022:

We continue to see more and more groups "in person". This is the life blood of our building.

One of the best returns to our facility this past year is the "classical conversations" home school group that began in September. They were gone 2021-2022 due to covid. I love having them back! It is the largest group to date. They use the entire children's wing upstairs and downstairs on Monday's from 8:00-4:30. I appreciate the care and respect they have for our building.

We also have our other building uses: bible studies, ladies events, TOPS, middle and high school youth groups and the SDA church which uses our gym facility on Saturdays. Oregon State "Cru" used our building in April for a retreat. Operation Christmas Child used our building in November.

My passion for our building is safety, security, and keeping our facility clean. My position is part time but I try to be available whenever needed. I get much use from the large carpet machine that was purchased several years ago.

Robert's Lighting installed security cameras last spring in 8 locations. A monitor was placed in the church office to keep track of entrances and parking. This is a huge improvement for security. We have several neighbors use our parking lot for their cars and trucks during the week. I monitor it for vehicles out of the "norm".

In July Nagl Floor Covering replaced the bathroom floors in the main hall of the children's wing and the gym. I worked along with Nagl to get the job done in a timely manner, pulling and re-installing the toilets and partitions so Nagl flooring could do the work. The new flooring looks great and is so much easier to keep clean.

In October Pastor Nick and I re-modeled part of the youth space. We moved two large cabinets from one room to another. He has more storage and the other room has more of the living room feel to suit his youth group needs.

I am so blessed to have an Administrative Board that supports my vision for keeping our facility looking and functioning efficiently. I am thankful for my friends that are also co-workers and attenders at CAC. Coming to work is a joy for and my purpose here is personally meaningful. May the presence of God Himself, The Lord Jesus Christ, be what is felt when people enter our facility.
